

MINUTES FOR THE TOWN OF SPRING GROVE
May 12, 2015
Held at Quaker Hill
7:00 p.m.

Board members present: Donna Catron, Norma Wright, Murlin Clark, and Adolph Werner.
Others: Carol Polver, Joseph Kaiser, Ben Lukacek, Anna Lukacek, and A. J. Sickmann.

BZA chair Kaiser explained he had contacted Mr. Rodgers, whose question at the March meeting was a reference to all or any monies received from Reid Hospital for uses by Spring Grove, and not specifically for roads and streets. Mr. Clark moved, seconded by Mrs. Catron, to accept the explanation. Unanimous.

Mrs. Catron moved, seconded by Mrs. Wright, the minutes of the April meeting. Unanimous.

Mr. Werner reviewed the following dates: May 15-17 will be the Spring Grove clean up days, May 29, the Iron Man race will be taking place and Waterfall Road will be closed except to local traffic.

Carol Polver, nominee for BZA board membership, was recused. Mr. Werner then moved, seconded by Mrs. Catron, approval of her membership to the BZA. Unanimous.

The subject of beauty parlors again was discussed. Mr. Werner volunteered to look into their existence and under which circumstances they were established.

Mr. Werner noted that President Hendricks expressed a desire that Spring Grove obtain a lock box at a local bank.

On the subject of pot holes, Mr. Werner has contacted various contractors with only Rinehart's responding, which would repair thirteen pot holes for \$2,100. Mr. Clark moved, seconded by Mrs. Wright, to hire Rinehart. Unanimous. Mr. Werner then discussed the need to obtain an estimate of refurbishing all streets and roads in Spring Grove.


A. J. Sickmann explained he had sent a letter to the Unclaimed Property Division of the Office of the Attorney General and stated he has been informed that the request for the refund of \$11,000 is being processed. He said he would call every thirty days until the entire amount had been refunded.

Again, the subject of speed humps was brought to the attention of the board. Mrs. Wright said she favored waiting until President Hendricks returns before making a decision.


At 7:40 p.m. Mr. Clark moved, seconded by Mrs. Wright, to adjourn. Unanimous.
